plants has been around for decades – and even happens naturally!

Learn effective methods of growing plants from cuttings as you walk the grounds of the Marin Art and Garden Center, gathering good candidates (or cuttings) for cloning. Find out about proper storage and preparation techniques that will increase your chances for successful cloning.

Discover how to transplant rooted cuttings and become skilled at choosing correct rooting mediums.

All participants will take home a variety of cuttings to nurture and grow in their own garden.
